1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable law and the accounting standards issued by the Accounting Standards Board and promulgated by the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Ireland (Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in Ireland), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated).

1.3 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Repayments of loans are waived by the Corporation so long as the properties continue to be occupied by eligible persons.

A SEAI grant amounting to €68,510, repayment of which is waived so long as the company continues its charitable works.

9 Pension costs

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. The pension cost charge represents contributions payable by the company to the fund. The amount paid into the pension scheme during the year was €116,334 (2011 - €146,824).
